I was ready to get out of there and quick. I left after 12 days and was back a few weeks later hoping they'd send me to long term and they did. Mrs Bren and I immediately clicked the first time around so i was looking forward to spending more time with her:)We both wanted to save the world, especially animals.She was the type of person that I was convinced didn't exist. Not only was she beautiful on the outside but was also on the inside??! So after my 90 days was up and it was my time to leave and face the real world again I didn't figure I'd keep in touch with many people considering there were a ton of "me's" that came and went. Well Bren and I have been in contact every since. She watched me go from a rough around the edges teenager to a young adult. I loved telling her that I was getting engaged because she saw me cry until I was blue in the face being scared I'd never get to be happy and live a "normal" life. Everything started to fall in to place for me and she was sooo happy for me. Her last text message she sent me January 25th ended in " I've invested in many years seeing you happy"... It gives me some peace that she got to finally see me be genuinely happy. I will never forget how much she has helped me and been there for me. If I ever have kids and I am lucky enough to have a girl I will be naming her after Bren. She is gone but never will be forgotten. Her family and everyone else's life that she touched like mine are in my prayers.

My children speak highly of her and have joined me in prayers for both you and her. What I learned from John is that God is in charge of your birth date and your death date. We can not change this. We can not make babies come early and we can not stop labor to keep the baby in. It is the same with death so what we have is a middle.
