Charles (Chuck) Powers Flowers went to be with the Lord on December 27, 2022. Chuck was born in Hoxie, AR on May 28, 1943. He started his medical career at St Bernard's in Jonesboro while still a teenager. This inspired him to become a nurse and then a CRNA. He spent his 40+ year nursing career in hospitals in Missouri, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Most of those years were spent at St. Bernard's Hospital in Jonesboro.

Chuck lived a life of Christian service through his church, First Baptist of Walnut Ridge, where he worked with the youth, was active in the men's fellowship and, at one time, sang in the choir. He also served others through his long-time membership in the local chapter of the Christian Motorcycle Association, sharing his faith at events and fundraising to support the needy. Chuck was a ham radio operator and belonged to the Lawrence County Amateur Radio Club.

He joined his wife, Mary Ann, in heaven, along with his parents, Archie and Nellie Flowers. He was predeceased by his sisters, Eva Jane, Jackie Pettit, and brother, Ed Flowers.
