Chester Leo Warnick, 79, of Hoxie, died March 18, 2012 at Lawrence Memorial Hospital.

Born December 16, 1932, he was the son of Frank and Leona Warnick. He was a coach and teacher at Lafe, Clover Bend and ended his teaching career at Hoxie with 32 years of service. He was a member of the Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church serving as a deacon and an Adult Sunday School teacher for several years.
