J.S. Fielder, 92, of Walnut Ridge passed away Tuesday, January 31, 2017 in the St. Bernard's Medical Center.

Born on March 20, 1924 in Fontaine, son of Tonnie and Lillie Simpson Fielder. He was a farmer, worked over 20 years at Texas Eastern Transmission, and was of the Methodist faith. He also was the Mayor of Sedgwick for 14 years, worked with the Sedgwick Water System, and was the Caretaker of Old Military Cemetery in Sedgwick for many years, up until he was no longer able.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his first wife, Evelyn Berry Fielder, and his second wife, Mary Bellah Fielder.
