Jimmye was a good cook, especially known for her baked goodies. She was an avid reader. She loved her family more than anything, but most of all, she loved the Lord. Even when her health caused her to go into a nursing home, she would still write encouraging notes to family and friends, and pray for them every day. She also loved her “grand-dogs.” She played the piano by ear, and enjoyed hearing and singing hymns. She instilled a love of reading and music in her children and grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; sisters Nita Allen, Helen “Tynse” Bassett, Alyce “Toots” Binzer; and brother Robert “Bud” Moore. She is

survived by her sister Jeannie Smith of Hoxie; children Carolyn (Steve) Fox of Salem, Florida, Sara Caldwell of Bossier City, Louisiana, and Bill Long of Little Rock. She is also survived by grandchildren Kathryn (Greg) Cowles and John Caldwell, both of Jonesboro, and great-grandchild Phoebe Cowles of Jonesboro. She is survived by many nieces and nephews, whom she loved very much. She had all their birthdays written on her calendar so she could pray for them on their special day.
