Warren Edward Graddy, 93, of Hoxie, passed away November 3, 2014 at the Lawrence Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Graddy was born February 26, 1921 in Lawrence County, and was the son of Oliver Lee and Minnie Brown Graddy. He served in England as an airplane mechanic in the Army Air Force during WWII, and was a farmer and a rural route mail carrier in Hoxie.

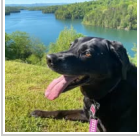
